

School of Choice 2023/24 2nd Semester Important Things to Know

Grades K-12

- Applications are being accepted for a limited number of non-residents School of Choice students in grades K12 in the Clarenceville School District for the 2nd semester 2023-24 school year. The availability is
 determined by the Clarenceville School District.
 - The Clarenceville School District application period is January 8, 2024 January 19, 2024 at 4:00 p.m. If the number of applications received exceeds the number of spaces available, a lottery will be held on Monday, January 22nd at 10:00 p.m. as specified by state law. All applicants will be notified of their enrollment status on January 22, 2024.
 - If your student's name is not drawn in the lottery, we will maintain your student's name on a waiting list and notify you if a seat becomes available, up to the end of the first week of the 2nd semester of school.

All Grades

- If the applicant is notified of their application acceptance, the required enrollment documents including
 Affirmation of Prior Discipline and High School Transcripts must be submitted no later than January
 26, 2024. Failure to do so will result in the loss of your seat within the District.
 - o Enrollments are completed online.
- All applications will be screened for accurate information. This may involve contacting your child's former school district. Please note that all Schools of Choice enrollments are contingent upon receipt and review of the applicant's prior discipline record and High School transcripts.
 - o Falsification of the requested information may disqualify a student from being considered or admission or my result in removal from Clarenceville Schools if enrolled under false information.
- Once enrolled through Schools of Choice, students may remain in Clarenceville School District until graduation if the student complies with all guidelines for School of Choice and the District's Student Code of Conduct.
- Attendance Schools of Choice students are expected to arrive and depart from school on time. Students who are excessively absent or tardy are subject to the same rules and procedures as resident students. It is expected that parents/guardians will pick up students on time upon the completion of the school day or after school event.
- Code of Conduct All Student Code of Conduct rules, procedures, and polices apply to all students who enter Clarenceville School District under the School of Choice guidelines and procedures.
- Transportation Parents of Schools of Choice students must provide transportation to and from school.
- Schools do not provide free childcare. A fee-based before and after-school childcare program is available for elementary age students.
- If your student is currently eligible for special education programs and services and you reside outside of Oakland County, please be aware that Clarenceville School District is required to secure a "Cooperative Agreement" regarding reimbursement for special education costs from your resident district before we can enroll your child in our school district.
